Updates on Remote Learning Survey Results, Google and Zoom Security, and Consolidating Communications

April 8, 2020

Dear Great Hearts San Antonio Families,

I am writing to you this afternoon to share three updates about Great Hearts remote learning.

Update 1: What We're Learning from Last Week's Survey

Last Friday I asked you to spend a few minutes sharing your honest experiences about remote learning so far. Thank you to the more than 1,200 families who have responded.

Here are the overall, GH San Antonio-wide responses to the four questions in the survey:

- 93.3% of families think the student work is meaningful and substantial
- 19.7% of families think the quantity of work is too much
- 82.1% of families think that the amount of required parent support has been reasonable
- 85% of families are having a positive experience with packet-based remote learning

Many of you shared comments that help us get more into the particulars of your experiences at specific campuses and grade levels. Right now, we are reviewing all of the responses, and the days ahead, our headmasters will be sharing with you what they have learned and how the schools will be making adjustments to better serve your children and you in these challenging circumstances.

We will be asking you again to give us your comments and help as we go forward together, especially as we make another paradigm-shift to the new world of Google classroom and the careful, limited use of Zoom videoconferencing.

Update 2: Google and Zoom Security Questions

There has been national news coverage of late about the vulnerability of the Zoom platform to uninvited outsiders. As a defense against this vulnerability, all Great Hearts teachermanaged Zoom sessions with students are being run with a very important security protocol in place, the so-called "waiting room" function that requires a teacher to admit individual participants one by one. Teachers also have the power to keep video off as a default until the identities of participants can be confirmed. We are convinced that rigorous adherence to this protocol will keep our Zoom spaces safe, orderly, and conducive of learning, just as you expect the Great Hearts classroom to be.

We have also received a number of questions related to the security and desirability of utilizing Google classroom as a tool for remote learning. We have also heard from many families who place a premium on limiting 'screen time' for children. As a fellow Great Hearts parent who shares <u>all</u> of these concerns and whose children will be using these platforms, I share your need for satisfaction that our students' data, conversations, and privacy are secure. - 2. **IT Tech Support** Academy-specific emails for tech support as well as basic computer troubleshooting are provided.
- 3. **Google Classroom Family Walkthrough** Step-by-step instructions are provided for navigating Google Classroom with any device.
