Dear Families,

We recognize that the challenges of navigating at-home distance learning for your children are far from the only challenges your family is coping with right now.

As we seek to nourish your child's mind and heart as best as we can within the restrictions of the school closure, your feedback is important to adjustments we make for remote learning going forward.

Remote Learning Survey

In ordinary times, a strong classroom education is based upon a partnership between school and home, and in extraordinary times like these, that partnership is no longer just the basis, but is nearly the entirety of the work of remote learning. We are here to serve; please give us your candid and complete feedback on how well we are serving your children and you.

As we begin moving into the next phase of remote learning, we will be using more online resources like Google Classroom and Zoom. Zoom will be a key tool to help continue the relationship between our faculty and students as they meet face to face. Teachers are currently using it to host tutoring sessions with their students; headmasters have used it to connect with their seniors; and we are continuing to explore how to further leverage this important resource. As we move into the digital space, the connection between teacher and student will still remain central to the delivery of our mission.

Refunds & Belonging Retrieval

With <u>the closures through the rest of the school year</u>, we know that there are many things that are impacted for our families. One of the first things we're working through is how to refund the different fees (such as Athenaeum, full-day Kindergarten, athletics, field trips, etc.) back to you. During this unusual time, there are many hardships that we are facing, and we want to partner with you in order to ease whatever worries that we can. Please expect more details from your school leadership team over the next two weeks.

We also realize that many of you would like to recover items from desks and lockers. We are working to create a plan that allows you and your students to get these belongings in the safest manner possible. We will have specific details to you by Friday on how to get your items. The current plan is to have all belongings back to families by the end of next week.

With the executive orders from Governor Ducey, we also want to make sure to remind you that schools are considered essential during this time: pickup of packets and devices will continue.
