GHAZ Covid-19 Response Guidelines

Positive COVID-19 Test, COVID-19 Diagnosis, or Waiting for **Testing Results**

Isolation Guidelines:

Return to school contingent upon completion of all 4:

- 1. **24 hrs** fever-free w/o fever reducing meds
- 2. Improvement in respiratory symptoms
- 3. 5 days have passed since first symptoms started or 5 days from positive test if subject is asymptomatic
- 4. Subject should wear a mask for an additional 5 days on campus. If individual cannot wear a mask, please stay in isolation for 5 additional days.

PCR and Antigen tests are now accepted. Antigen Home Tests are accepted as well. Antibody tests are still not accepted. (updated 9.13.21)

Actions:

- 1. Campus Response Team will notify Maricopa County Public Health Department, and Executive Director. HR will also be notified if subject is an employee
- 2. Executive Director will assemble the GH **COVID** Response Team
- 3. Close off and disinfect all non-porous surfaces asap
- 4. Determine where the student or employee has been and whom they have had close contact with for the past 48 hours. Close contact is defined as within 3 ft for an accumulated period of more than 15 minutes.
- 5. Communicate directly to all adults/students who have come into "close contact" with the subject and ask them to watch for symptoms for the next two weeks. Close contacts may guarantine for 5 days followed by 5 days of mask-wearing at school or remain at school and wear a mask for 10 days unless symptoms develop.
- 6. Communicate in a manner consistent with other infectious disease notifications and legal confidentiality requirements to:
 - a. All Faculty members if subject is a faculty member
 - b. Families in the same section as the student/teacher
 - c. All teachers of the student if the subject is a student
- 7. If Teacher/staff determine coverage
- 8. School Closure, section or grade level guarantines will be determined by the

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Close Contact with Someone Who Tested Positive for Covid-19

Someone who was within 3 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period* starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.

Isolation Guidelines:

- If asymptomatic: Close contacts may quarantine for 5 days followed by 5 days of mask-wearing <u>or</u> remain at school and should wear a mask for 10 days. Teachers should return to work with a mask for 10 days unless they develop symptoms. It is recommended that all close contacts test before returning to school. (Updated 12.30.21)
- If mild to moderate symptoms develop, and/or the individual <u>tests positive</u> five days after exposure, continue or start quarantine and return 5 days after first symptoms appeared and 24 hours of being fever free without medication if respiratory symptoms have improved. Subject should wear a mask for an additional 5 days while on campus.
- If mild to moderate symptoms develop, and <u>individual tests negative five</u> days after exposure, return to school <u>if 24 hours have</u> <u>passed without a fever and respiratory</u> <u>symptoms have improved</u>. (updated 12.30.21)
- 4. If mild to moderate symptoms develop, and <u>individual does not test</u>, continue or start quarantine and return 5 days after first symptoms appeared and 24 hours of being fever free without medication if respiratory symptoms have improved. Subject should Wear a mask for an additional 5 days while on campus.

Actions:

- If subject is a close contact of someone who was positive on campus, keep track of subject and watch for symptoms. Ask subject to wear a mask for 10 days. Updated 8.16.21
- 2. If subject has symptoms, see isolation guidelines.
