

SAFE RETURN TO IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION AND CONTINUITY OF SERVICES PLAN (RIPICS)

As we continue to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic, Great Hearts Texas maintains its commitment to quality classical education, with the health and safety of our students and staff as a top priority. The following Safe Return Policy promotes the health and safety of our students and staff as we return to in-person instruction.

Health and Safety of Students and Staff

- Parents will be reminded to continue to screen their child for symptoms of COVID-19 and other contagious illnesses and not send students to school when they are exhibiting symptoms (please see our [Home Screening](#) criteria). Faculty and students should follow Great Hearts Texas' [Attendance Guidelines](#) for illness. Parents should screen their students each day for symptoms of contagious illness, including COVID-19.
- Students and staff members who test positive for Covid-19 must remain off campus until specific readmission criteria set by the Texas Department of State Health Services are met (please see readmission criteria [here](#)).

Social Distancing

- In accordance with TEA guidelines, Great Hearts Texas will no longer require social distancing as a result of classrooms, multi-purpose rooms, and lunch rooms returning to full capacity. However, individual campuses are providing distanced dining options (as they are capable according to their specific facilities). Desk shields have been removed due to lack of evidence for their effectiveness in reducing transmission.

Test-confirmed Positive COVID-19:

- Students that are test-confirmed positive for COVID-19 should isolate for 10 days and, if asymptomatic at that time, they may return to campus.
- Faculty and staff that are test-confirmed positive for COVID-19 should isolate for 5 days and, if asymptomatic at that time, they may return to campus. It is recommended that they wear a mask for 5 days upon returning to campus to minimize the risk of infecting others.
- Positive cases of COVID-19 must continue to be reported to the school nurse who will report to the county health department as required by law. Parents may email covid@greatheartstx.org to report a positive case.
- In the instance of a test-confirmed positive case that has been on campus during infectious period, grades/sections of the positive individual will be notified, as required by Texas law.

Close Contacts:

GreatHearts

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- While Great Hearts Texas will not conduct contact tracing for cases that occur on campus, if a scholar is known or suspected of being in close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual, parents may opt to quarantine their child for up to 10 days and this will be an excused absence. See the [CDC Guidelines](#) for the definition of “close contact”.
- Great Hearts Texas retains the authority to temporarily close section, grade levels, or schools to reduce spread. This will be done in consultation with state and local health authorities.

Face Masks:

- In accordance with Governor Abbot’s Executive Order [GA-36](#), masks are optional for everyone on campus.
- Any student or staff member who wishes to wear a mask will be supported in doing so. Masks must continue to comply with our current uniform policy.

Maintaining a healthy environment:

- Current air filtration systems put in place at the beginning of 20-21 school year will continue, which [have been shown](#) to have a positive impact on student attendance. These are MERV-13 filters which are considered the highest-grade filter outside a hospital and can filter viruses.
- Each classroom and restroom will be disinfected at the end of each school day using a disinfectant that is COVID-19-approved by the EPA.
- All high touch areas will be disinfected at the end of each school day. High-touch areas may include but are not limited to backs and arms of chairs, desk tops, door handles, stair rails.
- The cafeteria will be disinfected between lunch periods.
- Cleaning supplies are available in each classroom and common area to periodically clean high-touch areas in classrooms during the school day in an effort to maximize room to room cleanliness.
- Efforts to ensure proper handwashing and respiratory hygiene will continue, providing both students and staff instruction at the beginning of the school year as well as providing hand washing opportunities and frequent use of hand sanitizer.

Accommodations for children with special needs:

- Students who have disabilities will receive the needed accommodations to ensure their safety while they are on campus or attending any campus-related events.
- Parents of students with special health needs, especially those who are immunocompromised, should contact their campus nurse or email our district nurse at Kristen.vonberg@greatheartstx.org.

Testing:

- Rapid COVID-19 testing is available free of charge to any student or staff with COVID-like symptoms, at the discretion of the campus RN. Consent for testing is required and a consent



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form can be found [here](#). Please email covid@greatheartstx.org if your child has symptoms and you would like to have them tested.

Campus visitors:

- All visitors to campus should [self-screen](#) for COVID-19 prior to entering facilities. Anyone with symptoms should not enter.

Vaccines:

- Per [Gov. Abbott's order](#), Great Hearts cannot require students or staff to get vaccinated. At this time, the State of Texas has not added the COVID-19 vaccination to the required immunization list for students. Further, Great Hearts cannot require students or staff to report vaccination status.
- COVID-19 vaccines are widely available and are approved for anyone 5 and older. You can find a vaccine by going to www.vaccines.gov.

Coordination with state and local health officials:

Great Hearts will remain in communication with local health and state officials concerning and changes or safety updates pertaining to COVID-19. These changes will be updated (when appropriate) and included in updates to Great Hearts stakeholders.

These guidelines are subject to change in the event that local COVID-19 cases increase, or at the direction of state and local authorities. Modifications to these guidelines may be made at the discretion of individual campus covid response teams as conditions warrant.

Great Hearts' health services are one facet of the continuity of services to students that we provide, which also includes our commitment to meeting the academic, social, emotional, mental health, and nutritional needs of our scholars.
